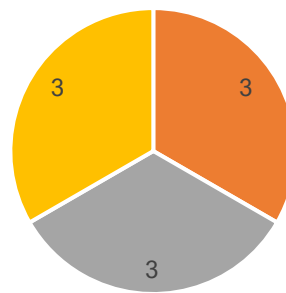


Polls 1-6 were asked during the virtual sessions, and the accompanying charts and ratings illustrate attendees' answers. Data is combined from both sessions.

Chart 1: Community of Residence (N=9)



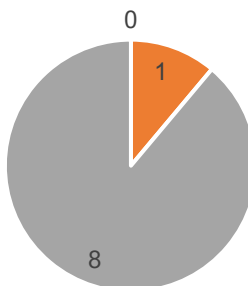
■ Ione ■ Jackson ■ Sutter Creek ■ Other area of the County*

Chart 2: Rating of Community Efforts to Address Homelessness (N=9)



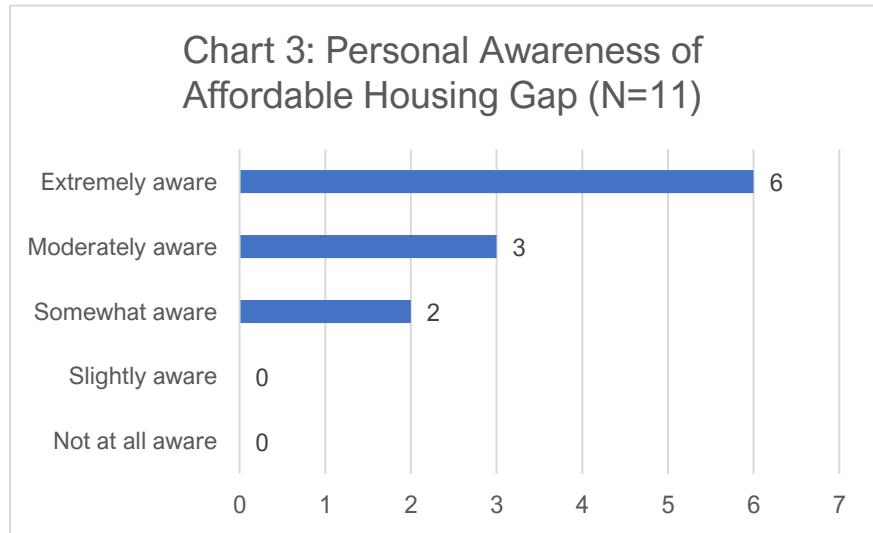
■ A very good job, doing everything it can ■ A good job, but more effort is needed

Poll 3: Before this presentation, how aware were you of the gap between the need for and supply of affordable housing in Amador County?

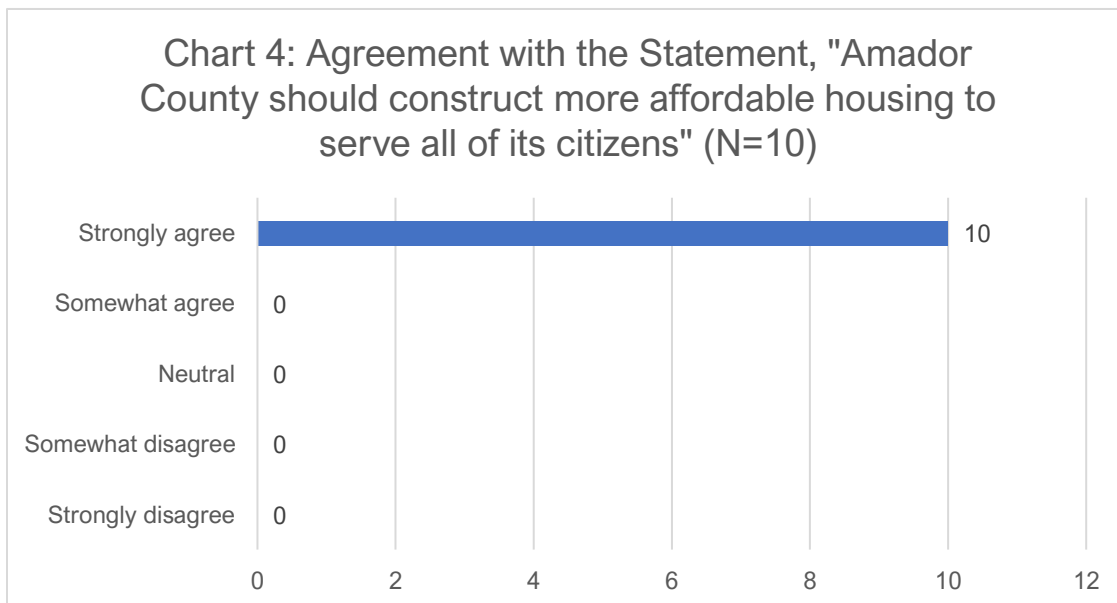
1. Extremely aware

5. Strongly disagree

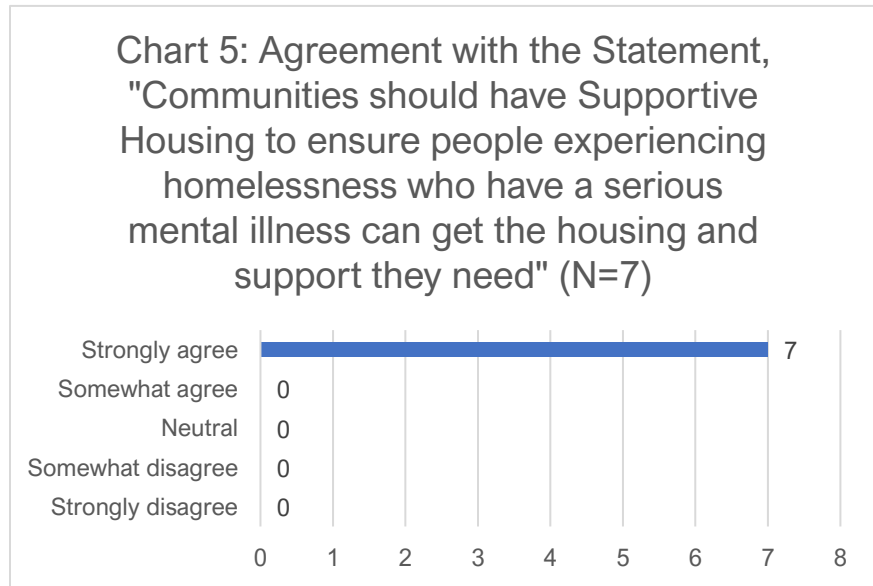


Poll 4 mean rating: 1 on a 5-point scale with 1 being “strongly agree” and 5 being “strongly disagree.”
