***Agricultural Handler** - An agricultural handler is defined as a business operating a farm for purposes of cultivating the soil, raising or harvesting any agricultural commodity for food or fiber, or a processing facility of agricultural commodities. Agricultural commodity means an unprocessed product of farms, ranches, nurseries and forests. Agricultural commodities include fruits and vegetables; grains, such as wheat, barley, oats, rye, triticale, rice, corn and sorghum; legumes, such as field beans and peas; animal feed and forage crops; rangeland and pasture; seed crops; fiber crops such as cotton; oil crops, such as safflower, sunflower, corn and cottonseed; trees grown for lumber and wood products; nursery stock grown commercially; Christmas trees; ornamentals and cut flowers; and turf grown commercially for sod.
